HOW TO USE

GENERAL HARD SURFACES:

Dilute 1:25 parts hot water (200ml per 5lt).
Wear disposable gloves. Remove any soiling & dispose of safely.
Mop or wipe surfaces. Do not rinse.

CARPETS:

Dilute 1:25 parts hot water (200ml per 5lt).
Wear disposable gloves. Remove any soiling & dispose of safely.
Wipe or spray contaminated area & leave for 5 minutes, apply further amount & gently agitate carpet with a soft nylon scrubbing brush.
Blot carpet dry with paper towels & dispose of safely.
